MAYORS COMMENTS

Mayor Meeks announced that there are a few people getting together tomorrow, Tuesday Jan.17, taking a trip to Morganfield, Kentucky to check out a Bio-Diesel plant that will be comparable to the facility they are wanting in Mt. Carmel.

Mayor Meeks introduced Brandi Stennett, who is now the City of Mt. Carmel's new Economic Development Director. Brandi said, "She is looking forward to great opportunities assisting the community with economic development, and also with grant opportunities."

Mayor Meeks again extended thanks to local residents Karen Mundy, Jim White and Peggy Cummins who helped make successful the first-ever "Fore the Kidz" golf tournament, a fundraiser for the new playground equipment.

Mayor Meeks, as the Liquor Control Commission, said he intended to approve a Class B (beer and wine) liquor license for Hogg Heaven in Mt. Carmel.

OTHER BUSINESS

The two zoning applications that were presented have been approved. These two applicants will use their mobile homes as their primary dwellings, or remove their structures within 60 days.

The (TIF) agreement with 1st National Bank, Ordinance #856, provides for a 70% reimbursement of the increase in real estate taxes, resulting from the most recent expansion project, for a period of 10 years. The previous (TIF) agreement for an expansion completed years prior to this most recent one, has expired.

COMMISSIONER BRUNSON - FIRE, HEALTH & SAFETY, GARBAGE, CITY HALL AND **CIVIL DEFENSE**

Commissioner Brunson extended an invitation for individuals to attend a special prayer service at Heartland Worship Center Sunday, Feb.19, at 2 p.m. Several pastors are expected to take part in the service, where they will pray for such entities as American government, local government, law enforcement, area churches, those in the military, and for jobs. COMMISSIONER FEARHEILEY - WATER AND SEWER

He also met with Superintendent Weirich and discussed things for next years budget. On the list was the 3rd Street water tower and filter system at the water plant. Commissioner Fearheiley said the water tower was in need of renovation and crews were trying to figure creative ways to clean the filters
