Mayor Woodcock stated that on Tuesday, March 14, 2000 there will be a Census 2000 Celebration and asked that every family would fly the American Flag in honor of this eventful day. Census 2000 representatives will be at South Elementary from 9:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m., from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. they will be at the Bellmont School, from 1:35 p.m. to 2:40 p.m. they will be at the Allendale School, and from 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. they will be at Mt. Carmel High. Representative will then travel to the nursing homes and back to St. Mary's from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Woodcock addressed Ordinance # 731, # 732 and # 733. He called upon Economic Development Manager Bill Maples at this time for more details. Economic Development Manager, Bill Maples, stated that this is the first of three ordinances pertaining to the Stevens site on North Cherry Street. Ordinance # 731 approves the plan for the targeted area. Ordinance # 732 involves the same topic and is actually designating the redevelopment project area for TIF district. Ordinance # 733 is actually adopting the tax increment financing over a 23 year period.

Mayor Woodcock called upon City Inspector Don Price at this time to discuss an application for subdivision of property. City Inspector, Don Price stated that he had received an application for subdivision of property by Don Sanford earlier this same day. LETTER OF INTENT

THIS Letter of Intent is being executed by the City of Mt. Carmel, Illinois, a Municipal Corporation (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "City"), to express its support and commitment to Vishram Properties, Inc., an _____ Corporation (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Developer"), in regard to the construction of a motel within the City of Mt. Carmel, Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits to be derived between the parties, the City states as follows:

THAT the City is the owner of the following described real estate, to-wit:

A part of the West Half of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 19, Township 1 South, Range 12 West of the Second Principal Meridian, Wabash County, Illinois, being described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of the said Southeast Quarter of Section 19; thence South 89° 33' 49" East on an assumed bearing along the South line of the said Southeast Quarter a distance of 660.24 feet to the East line of the said West Half of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 19; thence North 00° 48' 54" East along the East line of the said West Half of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter a distance of 369.73 feet to the North right-of-way line of Illinois Route 15 and the point of beginning; thence continuing along the East line of the said West Half of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter North 00° 48′ 54" East a distance of 1745.34 feet to an iron pin; thence North 89° 38' 16" West parallel with the North line of the said Southeast Quarter of Section 19 a distance of 400.01 feet to an iron pin; thence South 00° 48′ 54" West parallel with the East line of the said West Half of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter a distance of 1899.26 feet to the North right-of-way line of said Illinois Route 15; thence in a Northeasterly direction along the said North right-of-way line of Illinois Route 15 a distance of 303.72 feet on a curve concave to the North having a central angle of 4° 06' 36" and a radius of 4234.07 feet; thence continuing along said North right-of-way line North 63° 22' 45" East a distance of 127.07 feet to the point of beginning; said tract containing 16.81 acres, more or less.

THAT Developer proposes to build a forty (40) unit Super 8 Motel on a tract of land containing approximately two and one-half (2.50) acres lying on the Southerly portion of the lands owned by the City of Mt. Carmel abutting Illinois State Route No. 15.

THAT the City of Mt. Carmel hereby commits 2.50 acres to said project and agrees that if Developer, within eighteen (18) months from the date hereof, completes the construction of a forty (40) unit Super 8 Motel on said 2.50 acre tract, then the City of Mt. Carmel shall convey, without further consideration, said 2.50 acre tract of land to Developer; subject, however, to a restrictive covenant that Developer will not sell said land for a period of five (5) years.

THAT the City and Developer shall enter into a formal Commercial Development Agreement which shall, in greater particularity, set out the rights and responsibilities of the City of Mt. Carmel and Developer, Inc.

THAT the exact configuration of said 2.50 acre tract shall be agreed upon between the City of Mt. Carmel and Developer within ______ days from the date hereof, and shall be more fully described in said Commercial Development Agreement. Should the parties fail to agree within ______ days as to the exact location and dimensions of said 2.50 acre tract, then this Letter of Intent shall terminate and be null and void.

This Letter of Intent is given for the purpose of assisting Developer in obtaining the necessary financing for the contemplated project.

This Letter of Intent shall supercede and take the place of the Letter of Intent entered into with Meniville, Inc.

Re: BI-Weekly City Council Report

Commissioner Fearheiley:

- I collected routine bacteriological samples for the month of February. These samples are used to
 determine if adequate disinfection is taking place in the distribution system. A positive result would
 indicate the presence of bacteria and would require a series of follow up samples for confirmation
 purposes. This would also require a higher disinfectant residual be added to the distribution system for
 elimination of these bacteria.
- 2. Plant personnel received their annual self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) certification through the Mt. Carmel Fire Department. Personnel received instruction for wearing the SCBA, after which time they were examined for blood pressure, pulse rate, and respirations before wearing the SCBA. After performing simulated rescue evolutions, they were again checked to record final BP, respirations and pulse rate. If there were any major deviations from normal vital signs, they would not be qualified to wear an SCBA until they can correct the problem. All plant personnel received a clean bill of health.
- 3. The high service pumps received preventative maintenance. All of our high service pumps receive scheduled maintenance and are checked to ensure that they are good operating condition. As a result of this program, it has been determined that the motor that drives the mixing baffles for the clarifier is in need of repair. It is operating at near stress levels. We have opted to take this motor off line until such time that use of this unit is needed.
- 4. All other operations continue normally.

Report #127 March 6, 2000 City of Mt. Carmel, IL Jim Pfeister, Commissioner Streets, Parks, Cemeteries, & Levees

Our department personnel are doing all the regular activities, and they have been on their regular schedule of picking up bagged compostible material and limbs. All this material has been loaded into a dumpster.

The snow plows and salt speaders have been removed from our trucks. If it snows enough that the streets need to be plowed, we will have to reinstall the plows and spreaders, but let's hope that is not necessary.

The big project these last two weeks has been the cutting and removing of the trees and stumps on the new 13th Street right of way and about the city for a total of more than 25 trees. The tree crew also trimmed more trees in the city park.

Our personnel graded and rocked the emergency road under the railroad trestle that connects with the Southgate streets. This road is not intended for regular use, but would allow an ambulance to get around a stalled train.

Some other activities of the Street Department these last two weeks have been: patching pot holes, cleaning the boat ramps, spreading rock in the alley off the 400 block of Oak Street, behind Home Cafe, along the side of 1st Street off of Division, fixing a down spout at the Senior Citizens Building, and lastly replacing the decking on our large flatbed trailer.

Mayor, we still have a problem with four-wheel drive vehicles rutting up city owned property along the levee. The ruts these vehicles leave behind make it very difficult to mow this ground, therefore we have posted some no trespassing signs in selected areas. It is not our intention to keep people from using the old boat ramp or fishing from the banks of the Wabash, but from rutting up city property. It is especially important that all vehicles stay off the levee that protects many parts of Mt. Carmel.

Perhaps the most important thing we do this evening is to remind the citizens of Mt. Carmel to fill in their census letter correctly and return it promptly.
