# MEETING MINUTES March 20, 2000

Invocation was given by Rev. Don Masters.

Present on Roll Call: Mayor George Woodcock, Commissioners Jack Emmons, John Fearheiley Jim Pfeister and Dick Shoaff.

Absent: Jim Seaton, Louise Taylor, Dave Dallas and Ken Wood.

# **MAYOR COMMENTS**

Mayor Woodcock stated that the City Council meetings would continue on with the 5:30 p.m. time in order to be accommodating to the people.

Mayor Woodcock stated that the Illinois Department of Transportation has notified us that on April 3, 2000, they will be letting the contract for the construction of the new street that runs from 13th & Walnut to Poplar St. This will tie in the area from North School all the way to Poplar to open up traffic to the new Middle School.

Mayor Woodcock stated that he anticipates the new Super 8 Motel to begin soon and also anticipated to hear from Pamida within the next two weeks and looks forward to more additions and future growth within the city due to the numerous assets that Mt. Carmel has to offer.

Mayor Woodcock addressed the application for a Special Use Permit No. 00-SU-2, William Koonce. The applicant and owner of 36 Pecan wishes City Council approval to place a trailer on this vacant lot. No objections were voiced. City Inspector Don Price stated that this application has been approved by the Zoning Board of Appeals with the stipulation that the trailer would be used by the applicant or their immediate family.

Mayor Woodcock addressed the application for a Special Use Permit No. 00-SU-3, Carolyn Koons and Sheila Kays. The applicants and owners of 530 W. Second St. wishes City Council approval to place a mobile home on this vacant lot for Sheila Kays to reside. No objections were voiced. City Inspector Don Price stated that this application has been approved by the Zoning Board of Appeals and must be moved in within 60 days.

Mayor Woodcock addressed the application by Kenny Saxe, State Farm Insurance Company, to place a 3 x 8 aluminum frame sign 13 feet off the ground on the corner of Eighth Street and Market Street. City Inspector Don Price stated that the site is acceptable and existing signs are currently in place. No objections were voiced, therefore, the Mayor and City Council granted approval.

Mayor Woodcock addressed the application by Dwain L. Kieffer for the property at 10544 Wabash Avenue, which is on West Third Street, to have a 3/4" line for water and sewer service extended to said property. This service would be billed at the current double rate until the time that the annexation of the property is complete. This property is currently outside the corporate limits of the City and he agrees to enter into a binding agreement in which at a future time, it be contiguous to the City of Mt. Carmel, he will annex in to the City. No objections were voiced.

Mayor Woodcock called upon Commissioner Jack Emmons to elaborate on the yearly fund raiser done by the Senior Citizens. Order blanks for pizzas were made available to everyone and will be delivered on April 1, 2000. An additional fund raiser will be held on April 11, 2000, by taking a bus to Casino Aztar and everyone is invited to attend.

Mayor Woodcock inquired whether or not the City Engineer, Dave Dallas would need to do a study of Mulberry Street in which it would be considered for resurfacing. Commissioner Pfeister stated that the two priority streets considered for resurfacing this year were indeed Mulberry Street and North Market Street. He requested that the City Attorney, Tom Price check into financing for these projects.

Mayor Woodcock stated that in August the Highway Department hopes to let the bids out for the improvements to be done to Ninth Street from Walnut out to Willow Swamp Road.

Mayor Woodcock called upon Commissioner Jack Emmons at this time.

# COMMISSIONER PFEISTER - STREETS, CEMETERIES AND PARKS

# <u>COMMISSIONER SHOAFF - FIRE, HEALTH & SAFETY, GARBAGE, CITY HALL</u> <u>AND CIVIL DEFENSE</u>

Commissioner Shoaff thanked the Caseys for allowing them to use a couple of their houses on Ninth Street for training purposes. Commissioner Shoaff reminded the citizens that the City of Mt. Carmel does have a no burn ordinance for everything except yard

waste inside the city limits. A date should be able to be announced by next council meeting for the Spring Fix-Up-Clean-Up Week.

Fire Chief, Steve Partee was called upon by Commissioner Shoaff to discuss the elaborate training taking place. He stated that for the last three weeks they've had extensive training in fire fighting techniques and first aid. This training is not only beneficial to the fire fighters but is also used in the lowering of our rating for ISO Insurance.

# **COMMISSIONER FEARHEILEY - WATER AND SEWER**

Commissioner Fearheiley, gave the following report (see the attached copy).

#### ADDITIONAL REPORTS

City Attorney, Tom Price, addressed Ordinance No. 734 which would authorize a commercial development agreement with Vishram Properties, Inc. (aka Super 8). The City will take a mortgage for the 2.5 acres on West Ninth Street and Vishram Properties, Inc., in turn, will give the City a promissory note for \$50,000.00. No objections were voiced.

Detective Jeff Besing reported that the dispatchers for the Mt. Carmel Police Department have been in 911 training for the last several days and all has went very well.

Street Superintendent David Easter commented that all is running smoothly.

Waste Water Manager, Rob Windes stated that all is moving right along with the time consuming improvements taking place. The odor problems experienced last year should be cut down on considerably by these developments.

Water Superintendent Mark Weirich stated that he looks forward to the work to be done on the new water tower. All is running smoothly to date.

Economic Development Manager, Bill Maples stated that he has attended a seminar on Rural Affairs in Springfield, IL. Our application for a bike path is in review. We will also be submitting a application for a new Senior Citizens bus.

City Administrator Merle Weems stated that the ISO reporting should considerably lower the cost of home insurance for the Mt. Carmel residents within the next two years. Dave Dallas and Jim Pfeister will be traveling the streets of Mt. Carmel to evaluate surfacing needs and will be able to report on this subject at the next council meeting. Also, at the sewer plant, new doors and windows have been installed. In addition to this, estimates are currently being taken for replacement or patching of the roof which has started leaking just this week.

Meeting was adjourned.







RE: Bi-Weekly Report

The following are our activities for the last 2 weeks:

- 1. The water/sewer maintenance crew continued with their inspection of the sanitary collection system in the Northpark subdivision. They are using the truck mounted remote camera system to inspect suspected trouble areas in the collection system.
- 2. Greg Young attended the annual American Water Works Association conference in Springfield last week. These annual conferences are an important tool in keeping current with the trends in water treatment and distribution techniques. The IEPA has suggested using these types of conferences to keep current on continuing education requirements for operator recertification as well. Bill Miller also recently attended a technical conference in Effingham with the Illinois Rural Water Association.
- 3. Pipe has been delivered on site for the new water line that will serve the new 1 million gallon water tower. This water line will tie into the existing water line on Oak Street to fill the tower.
- 4. Utilities representatives from Mt. Carmel met with engineers from the Illinois Department of Transportation at City Hall last week to go over preliminary plans for the West Ninth Street improvements. A tentative schedule was presented in order to arrange to move any affected utilities for the improvements. Work should begin around August. The water/sewer department will have to relocate both water and sewer mains on both sides of Ninth Street. Plans are now being made for this project as all the necessary easements are acquired.
- Meter crews responded to a leak at 22 Pecan lane. Repairs were quickly made with minimal service disruptions.

All other operations continue normally.

# Report #128 March 20, 2000 City of Mt. Carmel, IL Jim Pfeister, Commissioner Streets, Parks, Cemeteries, & Levees

Our department personnel are doing all the regular activities, and they have been on their regular schedule of picking up bagged compostible material and limbs. All compostible material has been loaded into a dumpster.

The big project these last two weeks has been the complete overhaul of our large flatbed trailer. After the trailer was redecked, our personnel built new steel boxes on the front to store chains and tie downs for use on the trailer. They checked the wiring and repainted the entire trailer. Also around the shop our personnel replaced some broken teeth on the stump grinder, replaced a chain and two sprocket gears on the street sweeper, repaired some siding on the shop building, and have started repairing some rusty fenders on our 2155 John Deere tractor.

In Southgate Park, our personnel have started installing new storm drainage near the new spec building. This should help prevent some storm water problems in this low area. Our personnel also installed 30 feet of storm water culvert on West 10th St.

Mayor, if you have driven through the City Park lately, I am sure you have noticed how nice everything looks, except for a couple of things. Some people have been driving off the road in order to avoid the speed bumps and making mud holes and a lot of extra work for our workers. Secondly, kids have been moving our shelter house picnic tables out on the grass, and elevating one end to make ramps to skateboard on. Several of these tables have had to be repaired because of this. We would truly appreciate drivers staying on the road, and skateboarders staying off the picnic tables.

Some other activities of the Street Department these last two weeks have been: patching pot holes, spreading rock at the old theater, trimming low tree limbs which overhung the street in the 200 block of West 10th, hauling a protective fence built by Paul Kolb to the golf course, replacing bulbs in traffic signals, mowing the firing range, cutting six trees, grinding out 10 tree stumps, and lastly getting the bush hog ready for spring.
